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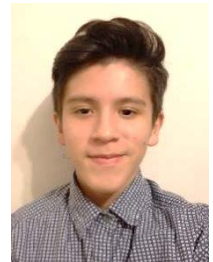

Dear Friend,

It is with supreme thankfulness to the Lord and great anticipation for a blessed and fruitful summer of ministry that we have the privilege of introducing you to the summer ministry interns for 2019! Each of these young people has been called of God to invest a summer of their lives serving Him in the inner-city, cross-cultural environment that is Philadelphia, PA. For six weeks, after graduating from Summer Missionary Training School, these young Christian college students will teach Bible lessons, share missionary stories and personally interact with boys and girls in the city.

First up is **Isaiah Carasas**, a sophomore Business major, from Pensacola Christian College, Pensacola, FL. Isaiah was recruited to work with us by Lucas Quiroz, one of our missionary returnees. Lucas shared how this missionary training has changed his life and gave him practical experience in sharing the Gospel with others. Isaiah wanted that for himself. This will be the first year for Isaiah to work with us, but he is joined by his brother, Daniel. This means that there will be more men on the missionary team this year than women. While that is unusual, it is wonderful to meet young men who sincerely want to follow the Lord's leading and learn how to minister effectively to children.



**Daniel Carasas** is a Business Management major at Pensacola Christian College entering his senior year this fall. Like Isaiah, this is Daniel's first year as a missionary intern with us. This is the first time we have had a team of brothers working with us over the summer since the Figueroa brothers, but both of these young men are eager to learn the details of how to teach children and how to counsel boys and girls for salvation. Daniel, like his brother, grew up in a Christian home and went to Christian schools. Both are excited to accept this missionary ministry position on faith, and they are eager to work together to increase heaven's number.

Rounding out the Pensacola Christian College contingent is **Modesty Hampton**. Modesty is joining our team from Denham Springs, LA. She is a senior in college, majoring in Elementary Education. Modesty said in her application: "God called me to teach and influence the lives of children for Christ . . . I can't wait to be a teacher! I especially love working with inner-city children!" Modesty is already teaching children in a Bible Club while at college. The children are going to really love being in Miss Modesty's club in Philadelphia.



**Tim Martin** is our next missionary team member. Tim is a sophomore at Bob Jones University. In his personal testimony, Tim recounts beginning to ask questions about the Gospel and sin at about age five, but it wasn't until a few years later that he was able to fully understand his need of salvation. Tim does remember feeling a distinct call to serve the Lord in missions at age nine, while attending a Christian camp. He is currently living out that calling by working with the Bob Jones University Urban Evangelism ministry, as well as participating in other college mission's trips. Tim has worked in his home church's children's ministry for the past six years . . . and we

believe he will be a huge asset to the Philadelphia ministry team this summer. We are excited to see what God will do in the lives of all of our missionaries this year.

**Molly Campfield** is a senior at Bob Jones University from Greenville, SC, majoring in Education. She wrote in her application that she grew up in a Christian home, and she accepted Christ as her Saviour at age 11. Today, she confesses that as she grows in her faith and continues trusting Jesus, she knows that, *“He which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ.”* On that basis she is accepting the call to join this missionary internship. We are thrilled that Molly has decided to serve the Lord here over the summer and we look forward to helping her in that process of growth and Christian maturity. Molly is the fifth “first-timer” on the team, but God has brought some “veterans,” too.



**Marissa Potter** is returning for her fourth year as a missionary in the inner city. Her consistency, experience, and strong sense of God’s direction for her inner-city ministry has added immeasurably to the team working in the 6<sup>th</sup> largest city in the U.S. The children love Miss Marissa’s sweet spirit and her impact in the lives of boys and girls is too significant to measure. She has been an invaluable part of our inner-city team in the past, and we are thrilled that she has agreed to return for another year of ministry work. She will be one of the anchors of this year’s team. There is one more “veteran” of ministry to introduce.

**Lucas Quiroz** is also a four-year returnee. This inner-city, cross-cultural work is challenging. The weather is hot or rainy, and the traffic is loud. There is the constant blaring of sirens, traffic jams, and the sheer varieties of cultures to deal with. This is hard work. When a missionary returns for a fourth year . . . it is a special blessing. The children in the city will be happy to see Mr. Lucas again. We are happy to see him, too.




A tremendous amount of effort has already taken place. Each one has submitted a multi-page application that includes their personal testimony, a detailed medical history, their academic records, and personal references. They undergo background checks and police clearances, and then they have to travel from their home states to attend and pass a rigorous two-week training school that, in some cases, has counted for college credit. What they need now is your prayers and financial help to sustain this vital ministry in the city.

It costs about \$6,000 for each of these young people to get the two weeks of training and then serve in the city for six weeks. That cost includes two weeks of training at Summer Missionary Training School. Added to that is a modest honorarium for six weeks of missionary service, room and board, transportation and all the materials needed to teach and disciple the children. In light of eternity, this is a small cost to pay. Children, who are spiritually lost, have no advocate. The body of believers praying and giving is their only hope.

Will you stand with us and help reach the lost boys and girls in the city of Philadelphia with the Gospel of Christ? The Scripture asks in **Romans 10:14**, *“... How shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher?”* We need your prayers and your help to make this a life-changing season of fruitful ministry. Thank you, from all of us here . . . and may God’s grace be multiplied to you!
